<u>First Reading</u>: **Acts 3: 12-19** (page 1095)

Peter and John discovered that the power of the risen Christ was at work through them, to heal as he had done. Peter explained this miracle, and called the people to repent and believe in the Messiah whom the Jews had rejected.

<u>Second Reading</u>: **1 John 3: 1-7** (page 1226)

We do not know what our life after death will be like. Our faith is that we shall see and know completely the Christ whom we follow here, and so we shall be like him. Therefore, we must here and now put way all sin.

Gospel Reading: Luke 24: 36b-48 (page 1062)

The appearances of the risen Jesus were always unexpected. This is Luke's end of the first Easter Day, and shows us Jesus still teaching his friends how the Scriptures were fulfilled in what has happened.
